Assignment #3 - An essay on "Geographical Fields"

In this assignment, you will first consider the notion of a field (or coverage, in OGC's jargon). First read the entry about geographical fields at Wikipedia: (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Field_(geography)). Then, read the four papers in following order: Couclelis, Kemp, Tomlin and Camara.

The Couclelis paper is one of the first theoretical perspectives comparing the 'object' and 'field' visions of the geographical world. It is a great paper that deserves to be read many times. Kemp's paper discusses the different representations of fields and the conversions between those representations. Tomlin's paper presents a generic overview of his Algebra proposal, that has led to a language for map operations that is widely used in different GIS. Please also refer to the ArcGIS manual for details on Map Algebra. Camara's 1994 paper presents an object-oriented approach to map algebra that has been implemented in the SPRING GIS (http://www.dpi.inpe.br/spring).

Then, write an essay on geographical fields (400-1000 words). Please present your vision of the topic and also consider the following issues:

- 1. What are geographical fields and what is their importance? What is the origin of the term 'fields'? Why do we use 'fields' to refer to natural landscapes?
- 2. What kinds of geographical entities does Couclelis classify as fields? According to her, are there entities that could be classified sometimes as fields, and sometimes as objects?
- 3. In Couclelis' view, are fields always represented as raster geometries in GIS? Does Kemp agree with this view? According to Kemp, what are some possible geometries for representing fields?
- 4. What are the similarities and the differences between the definitions of fields given by Camara and by Kemp?
- 5. What are the main differences between the map algebra languages proposed by Tomlin and by Camara? Provide at least one positive and one negative argument for each proposal.
- 6. How does the OGC represent fields using the "coverage" concept? What is the author that presents the view closer to the OGC perspective: Couclelis, Kemp, Tomlin or Camara?
